Faith-Full Pledge Drive

The following is what was said at the recent Congregational Meeting concerning the Faith-Full Music Pledge drive. There is one thing that needs clarifying: this is a two year pledge for a total of \$10,000 or \$5,000 each year and a total of \$5,000 each year or at total of \$10,000 from the Weaver bequest. We will have a total of \$20,000 to fund the Music Leader position and other music programs.

Please keep in mind the purpose behind creating and funding the position of Music Leader is #1 to fulfill the vision the congregation had in 2013 with our Dreams and Vison Process. #2 As Pastor Brian said in today's sermon, we seek to be a place where all can experience the healing power of music as we worship God, for those of us here now, and for the many who need a community like Faith. Church growth experts tell us people looking for a church come back because of three things: a connection with the pastors, a warm welcome from the congregation and inspiring music that lifts their spirits. We appreciate all of the wonderful volunteers who have provided us with beautiful music over the years. The Committee and Council feel it is time to build on this foundation with a professionally staffed music program to take us to the next step and to fulfill the dreams and visions of the congregation.

As you are all aware, we have a significant shortfall in our 2017 budget,

and there is no room in the budget for the added expense of a Music Leader. The Music Committee had been struggling with how to make this happen when a member of the Committee suggested we set aside \$10,000 from the generous bequest by Glen and Helen Weaver to have a matching pledge drive. So this is where we are today. The question is, are you willing to support the two year commitment to pledge money toward this goal?

Please prayerfully consider how God may be calling you to be part of this campaign. We have set a deadline of May 21 to receive your pledges. They may be emailed, mailed, or put in the offering plate.

As an update we have received pledges totaling \$1900 per year or a total of \$3800 for both years.

THE **PASTOR'S** DESK

Dreams and Visions Check-In 2017

Our recent discussion about music ministry at Faith made me realize it is time to revisit <u>all the Dreams and</u> **Visions** we developed way back in 2013; both to celebrate the progress with which God has blessed us, and to remember there is still work to do. Before looking at 5 of the 10 priorities

that came out of the D&V process (we will do the rest next month), I want to highlight one comment that we can celebrate with great joy. Our dream in 2013 was that Faith UCC would be a

"Vital and Engaged Congregation."

Jude and I have watched with gratitude and amazement the growth in vitality, people, energy, ministry, and joy at Faith UCC over these four years. God has truly blessed us and we are indeed vital and engaged together in bringing the Gospel to Bradenton. Below are five Dreams and Visions priorities of 2013 and some specific comments that helped clarify and shape them. Each is followed by my thoughts on our current progress. I hope you will be able to add your own examples as you think about the progress we have made together..

1. Full time pastor

There is free and open communication between pastor and congregation. For over 3 years Faith has had a full time pastor. Not only that, but that one full time position has become a shared one to the benefit of both the pastors and the congregation. I am happy to say that our Pastoral Relations **Committee (PRC) has done an** amazing job of allowing open and safe communication to take place during this time. They in tandem with the Church Council have helped us all navigate through potential conflict with grace.

2. Quality Music Program

We have a professionally staffed music program.

We have a quality music program with soloists, instrumentals.

Many have blessed us with their gifts over these years; Kirt, Anita, Bob, singers and instrumentalists. The addition of the Melody Choir in summer and the Sarasota Woodwinds were great new joys. We are making progress and now, as we move forward with our campaign for music, the sky is the limit!!

3. Small Group Ministries

• We have a variety of CE programs for various stages of adult life.

• Our programs are varied to give the community and members opportunity and outlets for their skills, interests and ambitions.

• We have support groups, Bible Studies, craft groups, social get togethers, book clubs, grief groups, friendship groups for those new to the community (Northern transplants etc) meditation and yoga classes.

• Members know each other well enough that we seek out and enjoy shared projects, activities.

Small Group ministry has blossomed over these four years. From IPad classes to storytellers; grief groups to book studies; we have welcomed many into Faith for study and drawing closer to God. We have many ways to get to know one another as well, Potlucks, Dinner and Dessert, River Services, and others. We have yet to have an official "new to the community" group, but perhaps 2018 is the year to try that!

4. Maintenance Fund

We make optimum use of our facilities to benefit others.

The sanctuary is enlivened by color, lighting, decorations, arrangements of seating, etc.

We have a newly painted sanctuary with new carpet.

We have a well-lit parking lot and building exterior.

Our land is used for a community garden to feed others.

Though this started as a financial dream, this dream has grown and become reality over these years. New AC, repainted sanctuary with new carpet, new roof and some recent exploration into new lighting



and other safety enhancements means our building is very different than it was 4 years ago. We continue to welcome NA and Nar-Anon, several HOA's and The Apostolic Church. This precious building, which many worked years to build and complete, is filled every day with people who are making life better for themselves and others. There is still some more ministry to explore with our building and grounds, but we are on our way.

5. Membership Growth--all ages

Our pews are full, our membership has increased.

We have younger, more energetic members.

Members are interesting and interested people.

We have found our "niche membership" and draw them in (early retirees, northern transplants)

Our attendance level is 100-150.

Our worship service is personal and varied, mixing traditional with updated worship.

Well, we are not at 100-150 yet, but we have had steady growth over these 4 years, and it is safe to say that we are successfully welcoming our niche membership and have met many new "interesting and interested" people these past 4 years.

Many who put this list together have gone to be with God. I wonder how they would feel about all we have done with God's help over these 4 years? I hope they would be pleasantly shocked and that they will continue to help us too as we journey together in Faith. I look forward to re-visiting the next 5 priorities in the July Follower.

Mission in ACTION: A chance for everyone to be helpful!

The Social Action and Missions Team (SAM) has found a local ministry that we want to help out and get others involved in helping too!

The DreamCenter of Bradenton is a non-denominational ministry that serves community meals, has a clothes closet, and bike ministry, and helps people with basic needs. They are busy every day of the week serving people, without judgment, in the downtown area. They work out of Central Christian Church building.

On Tuesday evenings from 6:30-8PM, they have an Open Warehouse in Palmetto, where they store items and prepare for the week's ministries. In that 90 minutes, volunteers assemble bag lunches for their Wednesday "Reach Walk" in the downtown area, organize clothes for their clothes closet, work on bike repair and prepare hygiene kits to give away, among other things.

SAM members have decided to target two Tuesday evenings a month (the first and third) and see if we can give them some help! The people there are sweet and dedicated, and we really enjoyed working with them. There are "sitting" jobs in addition to those that require a bit of moving around. Plenty for everyone! **Our next meeting will be Tuesday June 6.** Please think about joining the fun! There will be a sign-up sheet at church and we will be reminding people weekly. We will arrange carpools from the church parking lot.....Please pray about it. This is local people helping our neighbors.

Prayer, Healing & Meditation Service

Twice a month we offer a 45 - 60 minute service that includes prayer, prayer with other modes of healing, and meditation. Some of these activities are very familiar to us from our Sunday Worship. Others are more helpful in a small group setting (We have had from 5-10 people). One of the modes of healing we use is Reiki, a form of energy prayer that Pastor Brian was taught while working for Hospice of the Western Reserve. Below is a brief description of Reiki from The International Center for Reiki Training.

Reiki is a Japanese technique for stress reduction and relaxation that also promotes healing. It is administered by "laying on hands" and is based on the idea that an unseen "life force energy" flows through us and is what causes us to be alive. If one's "life force energy" is low, then we are more likely to get sick or feel stress, and if it is high, we are more capable of being happy and healthy. The word Reiki is made of two Japanese words - Rei which means "God's Wisdom or the Higher Power" and Ki which is "life force energy." So Reiki is actually "spiritually guided life force energy."

A treatment feels like a wonderful glowing radiance that flows through and around you. Reiki treats the whole person including body, emotions, mind and spirit creating many beneficial effects that include relaxation and feelings of peace, security, and wellbeing. Many have reported miraculous results. Reiki is a simple, natural and safe method of spiritual healing and self-improvement that everyone can use. It has been effective in helping virtually every known illness and malady and always creates a beneficial effect. It also works in conjunction with all other medical or therapeutic techniques to relieve side effects and promote recovery.

BUILDING REPAIRS AND SAFETY: Denny

Minutes with changes:

The meeting started at 7:04pm Pastor Judy started the meeting with a reading. Marge Hooie motioned to accept the minutes as printed in the Follower, and Sheryl seconded the motion.

Financial Secretary, Donna Blakey reported that \$1104.50 has come in for One Great Hour of Sharing. We have \$2,800 more in donations this year than last year during this time period. Judy Wetter motioned to accept her report and Babs seconded the motion. Treasurer, Marge Critelli submitted her report to the council. In her absence, Pastor Brian went over the budget. Pastor's Report: Pastors Brian and Judy gave their reports. There were six visitors on May 7. Many visitors find us through the website, meaning they have already researched and picked our church before they arrive. We just need to make sure they have a good experience and connect with them. Judy asks that the council be aware of newcomers and direct them to visitor bags and give them a friendly, short welcome and report back anything you find out so we can follow up with them in a positive way. The new books study starts in a couple of weeks and all the free books have been given out. We will see how this goes and might offer it as a community book study at another time. Melody Choir starts June 1 at 7pm and will continue through July and August. We are aetting pulpit fill for July 16.

Secretary, Faith Quici, reported that the hard surface floors are being done by Quality Counts for \$678 on June 5. The preschool will cover the cost. We are switching to a cheaper plan and getting a second internet line from Frontier. We will have an install date soon. The calendar was presented for May and June and changes were made.

60TH ANNIVERSARY OF UCC: We will have an Ice Cream social on June 25 to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the UCC. Some people were asked to help with this. **Finance Committee** is developing into a good team; we just need more people. Faith will post in the Follower about needing more members for this committee.

Sheryl reported for the Church Events and Fellowship Team. There was a lot of good feedback from those who attended the service at Emerson Point. We decided to establish the weekend after Easter to be our Emerson Point

service from now on. Here are some events coming up: July 22 will be the Pool Party/Potluck/ Dinner and Dessert at Richard's with co-hosts Denny and Judy; October 29, will be Octoberfest on the Patio with a cookout potluck; November 26, is thankfulness Hospitality hosted by the Praver Team: December 2, will be the women's Christmas tea hosted by Sheryl Overheidt Smith; December 10, is the Christmas Potluck and December 15, is the Dinner and Dessert Holiday party hosted by Richard Dilts.
