

Five Things You May

Not Know About a Pastoral Relations Committee

1. The PRC is a standing committee of Faith Church for the purpose of supporting and maintaining an open and healthy relationship among the pastors and members of the congregation.
2. The goals of the committee are: the professional growth and well-being of the pastors, and the promotion of mutual ministry between the pastors and the congregation, both of which enhance the effectiveness of Faith Church's mission.
3. As per our Church's by-laws, the Church's Vice Moderator chooses, with input from the Church Council, two members for this committee. The pastor also chooses two members. The Vice Moderator can participate or designate another church member. Our PRC was designed to be small enough to deal with sensitive and confidential issues, and large enough to be an effective resource to our pastor and congregation.
4. The PRC is a forum where members can express their expectancies of our pastor and gain insight to the pastors' specific abilities, limitations, interests and time constraints. The individuals on the Pastoral Relations Committee, as well as the committee as a whole, welcome phone calls, conversations and discussions of church member concerns, thoughts and ideas about the ministry of Faith Church.
5. The members of Faith UCC's PRC are: Carol Knight, Dick Card, MR Lembright, Deb D'Angelo and Barbara Brownell. Please feel free to ask any of us more about the PRC!

Thanks to the incredible generosity of our congregation, we were able to send a check for \$3,025 to the Florida Conference for their Disaster Relief Fund, the fund that helps in Hurricane recovery!

The collections we gathered totaled \$2,025, and the Church Council had voted to match up to \$1,000 of what was collected with money from the Mission Fund.

WHERE DOES THE MONEY IN THE MISSION FUND COME FROM?

When you hear that we donated money, or awarded grants from the Mission Fund, do you wonder where that money originated? It is money that the Church Council sets aside in the form of a tithe (10%) from money donated to the church in the form of special

bequests or other income, such as fundraising events, or even in the sale of property. (The church set aside money in this way after the sale of the corner lot a few years ago). Some money is in CD's and will be spent when they mature. Other money is available now. Social Actions and Missions Team makes recommendations to the Council on how that money is to be spent. The Church Council then votes to spend that money in that way. Currently we have about \$15,000.

What We Believe

We believe in the triune God: Creator, resurrected Christ, the sole Head of the church, and the Holy Spirit, who guides and brings about the creative and redemptive work of God in the world.

We believe that each person is unique and valuable. It is the will of God that every person belong to a family of faith where they have a strong sense of being valued and loved.

We believe that each person is on a spiritual journey and that each of us is at a different stage of that journey.

We believe that the persistent search for God produces an authentic relationship with God, engendering love, strengthening faith, dissolving guilt, and giving life purpose and direction.

We believe that all of the baptized 'belong body and soul to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.' No matter who – no matter what – no matter where we are on life's journey – notwithstanding race, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, class or creed – we all belong to God and to one worldwide community of faith. All persons baptized – past, present and future – are connected to each other and to God through the sacrament of baptism. We baptize during worship when the community is present because baptism includes the community's promise of 'love, support and care' for the baptized – and we promise that we won't take it back – no matter where your journey leads you.

We believe that all people of faith are invited to join Christ at Christ's table for the sacrament of Communion. Just as many grains of wheat are gathered to make one loaf of bread and many grapes

are gathered to make one cup of wine, we, the many people of God, are made one in the body of Christ, the church. The breaking of bread and the pouring of wine reminds us of the costliness of Christ's sacrifice and the discipleship to which we are all called. In the breaking of bread, we remember and celebrate Christ's presence among us along with a 'cloud of witnesses' – our ancestors, family and friends who have gone before us. It is a great mystery; we claim it by faith.

We believe the UCC is called to be a united and uniting church. "That they may all be one." (John 17:21) "In essentials—unity, in nonessentials—diversity, in all things—charity," These UCC mottos survive because they touch core values deep within us. The UCC has no rigid formulation of doctrine or attachment to creeds or structures. Its overarching creed is love. UCC pastors and teachers are known for their commitment to excellence in theological preparation, interpretation of the scripture and justice advocacy. Even so, love and unity in the midst of our diversity are our greatest assets.

We believe that God calls us to be servants in the service of others and to be good stewards of the earth's resources. 'To believe is to care; to care is to do.'

We believe that the UCC is called to be a prophetic church. As in the tradition of the prophets and apostles, God calls the church to speak truth to power, liberate the oppressed, care for the poor and comfort the afflicted.

We believe in the power of peace, and work for nonviolent solutions to local, national, and international problems.

We are a people of possibility. In the UCC, members, congregations and structures have the breathing room to explore and to hear ... for after all, God is still speaking, ...

LETTER OF THANKS

Sweet pastors, congregants and friends,

I want to thank all of you for your cards, notes and phone calls; they have lifted my spirits more than I could ever express.

I was just getting to feel so much better in early October and then the fall happened on October 11th, and that changed everything.

I was in a soft cast and thought I'd only be in it for about 4-6 weeks. On November 15th, everything changed again. My x-rays showed healing in one of my elbow bones. The other bone had not healed at all, so now I'm in a hard cast from my fingers to about 5 inches up the arm from my elbow. That cast may stay on for about another 4-6 weeks. I feel like I can't do anything. Even though I am right-handed, I never realized how much we need both hands to do so many things.

I won't see the doctor until December 3rd when more x-rays will be taken. Based on the results, I might have to keep the cast on longer or it may be

taken off. Whenever that happens, I'll be in Physical Therapy for many moons.

I'm not too steady on my feet and I'm sporting an English choir-boy hair style. I wear some crazy outfits to accommodate my cast and I'm hopeful that will change soon. By the way, my cast is hot pink honoring the breast cancers we have both had.

Thank God for Pat as she does so much for me and our precious Miya settles herself on my lap, quite a bit. I hope I'll see you soon.

Council Meeting Minutes November 18th, 2019

Present: Brian Bagley-Bonner, Judy Bagley-Bonner, Donna Blakey, Barbara Brownell, Richard Dilts, Connor Felix, Dorothy Gallo, Faith Quici, Linda Van Buskirk

Absent: Marge Hooie, Jenny Crocker, Lynne Keane, Marge Kirchner, Jennifer Hargis, Sheryl Overheid-Smith, PJ Wideman
Meeting opened at 6:31pm by Moderator Richard Dilts.
Pastor Judy Bagley-Bonner offered the opening prayer.

Moderator Richard Dilts noted that, while Council approved a change of the name of the Buildings & Grounds committee to Property Committee at the October meeting, the change must be approved by the congregation in the bylaws. A motion to amend and approve the October Council Meeting minutes as amended was made by Linda Van Buskirk and seconded by Donna Blakey. Motion passed.

Financial Secretary and Treasurer's Reports: Donna Blakey reported that church income has increased, however so have church expenses. Dorothy Gallo reported that per capita giving is lower than budgeted and suggested follow up to the article in the *Follower*. Barbara Brownell suggested an idea to put a "temperature gauge" type graphic in the narthex so we can track progress in a tangible way and that the per capita concept be clarified for members. A motion to accept the Financial Secretary and Treasurer's Reports was made by Linda Van Buskirk and seconded by Pastor Brian Bagley-Bonner. Motion passed.

Moderator's report: Nothing to report

Church Secretary Report: Faith Quici reported that the projector previously approved has been purchased. Council reviewed the calendars and made revisions.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Judy Bagley-Bonner reported that a special service for those who struggle with the holidays will be held on December 17th. Pastor Judy also stated that during service, "Prayers of the People" going forward will be focusing on the concept of speaking as if one is speaking their joys and concerns to God directly. Pastor Judy also announced that the Florida Conference grant for the music scholarship was approved and the church will be offering two scholarships of \$2500 each rather than four scholarships for \$1250 each.

Pastor Brian Bagley-Bonner stated that a guest preacher will be selected for their vacation on December 29th.

Pastor Brian Bagley-Bonner reported that there has been a donation to update and improve media and Facebook Live broadcasts.

Old Business:

Linda Van Buskirk gave an update on the "action table" which will feature sign up boards and information about the various events and opportunities in the church and wider UCC church missions. Each committee chair will be responsible for adding information or their respective areas to the action table. Dorothy Gallo made a motion to purchase the table and supplies to set the table in the amount of up to \$250, which was seconded by Barbara Brownell. Motion passed.

Linda Van Buskirk reported that she and others continue to advertise for the Tret Fure concert on February 8th, 2020. Linda stated that most of the sales are taking place online and a full house is expected.

Connor Felix spoke about the recent technical difficulties and limitations using PowerPoint presentations for services and offered an alternative option. A program called Easy Worship, which is specifically designed for church worship services, is available for purchase and is inexpensive. The media team will meet to discuss this alternative and report back to Council.

Discussion was held on the upcoming openings for church council.

Discussion on the annual congregational meeting and bylaw updates was held.

New Business: Church membership was reviewed for purposes of recording the most accurate number of members.

Department & Committee Reports:

SAM: Barbara Brownell provided an update on the LGBTQ 101 series, stating that a committee is currently working on improvements of the presentation to present once more to the congregation with the goal of presenting the series to the larger community. 6

Barbara Brownell also reported that November 24th will be "Habitat Sunday" which will feature a Mission Moment with the family of the recent church sponsored Habitat for Humanity house. There will be a special collection and a reception after service with information for Habitat for Humanity Manatee.

Downtown Ministries is still struggling to find a new location and will receive Faith UCC's continued support to include the biweekly work at the warehouse.

Barbara Brownell announced that there will be a special drive for providing Missions to Honduras in January. More information to follow.

The annual Christmas Fund collection will occur in December as well.

The SAM 2020 grant information is expected to be sent out on January 6th, with the grant applications to be due on February 3rd. The SAM committee will then review the grant applications and present their recommendations to the Council at the February 17th Council meeting, with an expected distribution date of March 1st.

The National UCC Conference has an initiative to raise funds for a movement called Affordable Housing in Immokalee for migrant workers and their families who are living in deplorable conditions and has pledged \$100,000 to the fund and is asking for individual churches to band together to match this amount for a total of \$200,000. Barbara Brownell made a motion to approve \$500 from the Mission fund to help support this initiative, which was seconded by Linda Van Buskirk. Motion passed.

Barbara Brownell also highlighted the recent event that an Illinois UCC was able to purchase \$5 million dollars in medical debt for \$38,000 and then forgave the debt as an example of how we can truly make a difference.

Worship: Moderator Richard Dilts asked about communion Sunday for December and it will be intinction. Dorothy Gallo and Sheryl Overheid-Smith will help serve communion, Connor Felix will read scripture and usher. Barbara Brownell, Dorothy Gallo and Sheryl Overheid-Smith will also usher. Christmas Eve service will be held December 24th at 7pm. Ushers will be needed as well as readers.

Community outreach: No updates to report.

Events & Hospitality: Moderator Richard Dilts reported that it was requested that the Birthday Hospitality be held on January 19th so as not to conflict with the Annual Congregational Meeting which will be held on January 26th after service. Dinner and Dessert for December will be held at Moderator Richard Dilts' home on December 20th. Main dishes and sides will be provided, however attendees are encouraged to bring their favorite dessert if desired. Dinner and Dessert in January will be held at Primos on January 17th at 6pm. 20% of proceeds that night will benefit Faith UCC.

Moderator Richard Dilts stated that the January Council meeting will be held at his home on January 20th with incoming and outgoing council members alike. Dinner will also be served.

Pastor Brian Bagley-Bonner stated that Manatee Pride is scheduled for March 21st. Linda Van Buskirk made a motion to approve up to \$100 for Manatee Pride, which was seconded by Dorothy Gallo. Motion passed.

Faith Care: No updates to report.

Christian Education: No updates to report.

Buildings and Grounds: PJ Wideman submitted a report in writing that the recent Fall Clean Up day went well and a lot was accomplished.

The closing prayer for the December Meeting will be conducted by Barbara Brownell.

Closing prayer was offered by Donna Blakey.

Meeting adjourned at 8:29pm.

Tis the Season to be Grateful

With the holiday season quickly approaching, I wanted to share how important it is to teach children about gratitude and help them to experience the joy of giving.

There are multiple ways to teach children how to express gratitude. At Faith Preschool, we talk about the importance of letting the person know that we are thankful for something they gave to us or something they did for us. While we express how important it is to say thank you, we also encourage activities that help the expression feel more real for the children. We often have the children draw a picture for the person they are thanking. This activity helps the children feel involved in expressing their gratitude and makes the expression fun and interactive. Preschoolers should be taught to say thank you, but the most important part of teaching gratitude is helping the children understand why they are saying these polite words.

Modeling gratitude as a parent is another way that children can learn the importance. It is helpful to talk to our children about how it made us feel when someone did something nice for us, whether that be in the form of a thoughtful gift, a few kind words or helping hand. Children are still learning how to identify the different emotions that they feel, so talking about how things make us feel as well can be beneficial for our children.

As parents, we can help children experience the joy of giving by changing our habit of asking, "What do you want for Christmas?" into "Who would you like to give a gift to?" This simple switch encourages children to think of others during the holiday season. Parents can help their child make a list of people and the gifts they would like to give. Ideas for gifts could include: a picture the child painted, a batch of cookies they helped bake, or even a Christmas tree ornament the child created. This activity will give your child a great sense of being involved in giving, not just receiving. When my children were little, their Grandmother would take them to the dollar store to pick out a gift for people on their list. This was such a simple thing to do, but such a memorable part of our Christmas each year and it helped my children to experience the joy and excitement of giving. As your children create gifts for family and friends, talk to them about how they think that person will feel when they open their gift. Sharing these feelings will help your children understand the joy of giving but then will also help them appreciate when they receive a gift, as well.

Another way we can help our children experience gratitude is by talking with them about the little things they are thankful for. This is something that can be done before they go to bed, during dinner time or during a car ride. Ask your child, "what made you happy today?" And, then tell them something that made you happy, too. Express to them that these are things we can be thankful for.

And now it's my turn to express gratitude. I would like to thank all of you at Faith UCC for providing Faith Preschool with a grant to improve our playground. Thank you!
