Why A Season of Creation?

The Season of Creation is a time to explore themes on God as Creator in our Sunday worship. Our liturgical seasons focus on incarnation of the Christ, his ministry, redemption and the sanctification of the church by the Spirit. But generally, the lectionary cycle spends a minimal amount time on creation.

While the focus of liturgical seasons has been useful, they run the danger of partitioning Creation, Redemption, and Salvation in the minds of our congregants. It is perhaps a healthier approach to comprehend the act of creation as one act of divine gracious love with the intention of the flow of Creation through Incarnation towards Salvation. Such a theological/biblical shift of perspective, however, places in relief the grace dimensions of Creation, Incarnation, and Salvation.

It recovers Creation not only as an event in the past but also an on-going creative process guided by the Spirit and moving towards an intended conclusion of salvation. It places the creation as an original blessing. For too long, western Protestant and Catholic theologies have started from original sin rather than original grace. They concentrate on the negative, human sinfulnes 3, rather than the grace of God. Beginning with grace rather than sin is healthier for our appritual formation and progress in Christian discipleship. Celtic and Orthodox Christians have preserved such a theological context of the priority of God's

grace, and only in the 20th century did such a perspective take root in Protestant and Catholic theologies.

The Season of Creation turns our liturgical attention to God's relationship with all creation and with our relationship with creation. Through worship, we renew and retore a crucial relationship with God's creation at time of climate urgency. Our Environmental Justice Minister, Rev. Brooks Berndt, has author a short book Cathedral on Fire, arguing that there is a Kairos urgency and opportunity to equip our churches for climate. He and the Environmental Justice Council have promoted the Creation Justice Movement to start the process of transforming our church to meet the escalating climate change impacting our world.i One of the initial steps is "greening our worship and theology," and the celebration of the Season of Creation in the right direction.

At this step, we need to use our worship to ask serious questions: "How can your congregation intentionally reflect upon God in relationship to caring for creation? How can it bring theological understandings of creation care and justice into its' services of worship?" Such worship re-orients us to the natural world, and this aims at a fundamental shift of orientation that can be carried forward at least one season in each of the liturgical seasons of the year. The goal is ecological conversion: a radical change of consciousness. Feminist theologian Elizabeth Johnson writes, "Ecological conversion means falling in love with the Earth as inherently valuable. Living community in which we participate and bending every effort to be creatively faithful to its well-being and cherish it with unconditional love." (Ask the Beasts)

Our ecological conversion starts with our worship and learning to pray with nature and discover the Spirit's presence. This is meant to give us a foretaste of creation redeemed and reconciled. It intends to foster creation-centered practices, educational programs, networking with the National Environmental Justice Council, and your own Conference Environmental Justice Team, and local environmental organizations such as the Sierra Club or 350, org, and so on:

September 1ST- A World Day of Prayer for Creation

Also, First Sunday of the Season of Creation (2024)

September 8th - Second Sunday of the season of Creation; "Take Your Share"

September 15th - Third Sunday Season of Creation; "Clean Up After Yourself"

September 22nd - Fourth Sunday of Season of Creation;

"Keep the house in Repair for the Future"

September 29th - Fifth Sunday of Creation; "What a Beautiful World!"

October 6th - We celebrate the <u>Feast of St Francis</u>...weather permitting outdoor service including a blessing of the animals.


